Active Learning By Colleges Of Education

AMO Programme is partnering with Colleges of Education in Ghana to empower the Colleges further develop and equip their students for their anticipated role as teachers.

Abetifi College of Education, Akropong College of Education, Kibi College of Education, and Presbyterian Women's College of Education have taken the lead and signed MOUs with the AMO Programme. Soon, others will follow, including the University of Education, Winneba.

As a result of these partnerships AMO Programme is providing training workshops for the tutors of these Colleges of Education. As an example, on Thursday, January 30, the Presbyterian Women's College of Education in Aburi, one of Ghana's oldest female colleges, hosted a successful Active Learning Workshop in celebration of its 97th anniversary. With 42 participants, including 34 tutors and 8 students, the workshop focused on utilizing 20 Active Learning Materials (ALMs) such as the Ghana Map, Puzzles, Adinkra Memory, and Tangram and many others to promote Active Learning. The event featured interactive sessions, reflections, and discussions on integrating these tools into lessons.

Another workshop was organized for the Presbyterian College of Education, Kibi. This workshop attracted 66 participants, including Senior High School teachers and students. The programme was structured into three rounds, emphasizing the practical application of learning tools to foster student involvement and improved retention.



Accreditation Of Amo Product By NaCCA

AMO Programme has obtained official accreditation from the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment (NaCCA). This accreditation signifies recognition of AMO's commitment to transforming education through innovative Active Learning Materials and a comprehensive teacher training. Each of the 20 products of AMO Programme has to be assessed and qualified by NaCCA as being aligned to the curriculum of Ghana Education Service. The accreditation is allowing AMO to expand its reach to more educational institutions, further supporting the development and engaging learning environment for teachers and students alike

The Extension Of Spraying And Drying Area Project

The AMO Programme has successfully completed the expansion of its spraying and drying areas, to enhance its operations. This newly extended space will provide a more secure and optimized environment for drying materials, ensuring they are safely processed and protected from external elements. With additional rooms for materials to be spread out, the new area allows for better airflow and faster drying times, ultimately improving overall productivity. The extension will accommodate a larger volume of materials, streamlining the drying process and boosting operational capacity.
