AMO Programme Participates in Gender-Responsive Budgeting Workshop by ACEPA.

The AMO Programme recently participated in a Gender Responsive Budgeting workshop organized by the African Centre for Parliamentary Affairs (ACEPA).

The workshop brought together Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and advocacy groups to analyze the Government of Ghana's 2026 Budget through a gender lens. Participants examined how national budget allocations impact women, men, girls, and boys, with the goal of promoting fairness, inclusion, and equitable access to resources.

During the sessions, participants were taken through the budget formulation process, key principles of gender responsiveness, and the importance of integrating gender considerations into national planning. Group discussions focused on critical sectors, including education, and the Affirmative Action Law, highlighting gaps and opportunities for more inclusive budgeting.

AMO Programme's participation reflects its continued commitment to advocacy for inclusive education and social development. The engagement also provided an opportunity to network with key stakeholders and share information about AMO's work, including the distribution of brochures to fellow participants.



Map of Ghana – Puzzle Learning Material

The Map of Ghana Puzzle is an interactive learning tool designed with all 16 regions of Ghana carefully cut out as individual puzzle pieces. Each region is marked with a distinct colour, and when a piece is removed, it reveals the capital town of that region.

This learning material helps learners understand the shape and landmass of Ghana, as well as the location of each region in relation to the cardinal points. Through hands-on engagement, learners develop problem-solving skills, hand-eye coordination, focus, and language skills as they identify, match, and assemble the puzzle pieces to recreate the map.

The map is suitable for Basic 4 to Basic 7 learners. It supports students in identifying the names of regions, their capitals, and key regional features, while encouraging critical thinking and spatial awareness. By selecting and fitting the correct puzzle pieces, learners strengthen their ability to concentrate, analyze patterns, and solve problems in an enjoyable and practical way.
