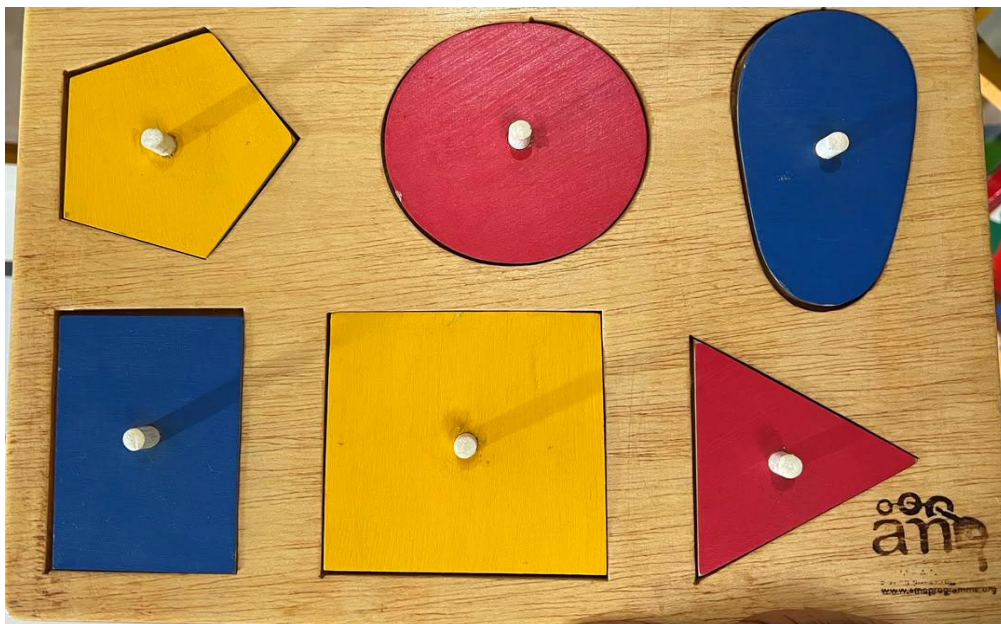

In the month of July, AMO Programme led a tree planting exercise at the AGOGO Women's training College of Education and looking forward to plant more trees at part of its 30-years anniversary. The activity also provided an opportunity to engage the younger generation on the value of trees and the role everyone can play in addressing environmental challenges. For AMO Programme, the initiative forms part of a broader reflection on its three decades of service and its vision for the years ahead.



PRODUCT PROFILE; TODDLER PUZZLE

AMO Programme's toddler puzzle is designed to help young learners identify and understand basic shapes through play. The colourful educational puzzle features a variety of shapes, including circle, triangle, oval, rectangle, square and hexagon. Learners are encouraged to remove the individual shapes and fit them back into their corresponding spaces, turning the learning process into an engaging hands-on activity. The puzzle is particularly suitable for children from Basic 1-3, where learning through play and practical activities is essential to the development of early cognitive and motor skills.



Through the process of removing and fixing the shapes, children can develop their ability to recognise different shapes, match objects and improve hand-eye coordination. The activity also encourages concentration, problem-solving and fine motor skills as learners work to place each piece correctly. The bright and attractive colours of the puzzle serve an additional educational purpose. They help children begin to recognise and distinguish between different colours while interacting with the various shapes.

The AMO Toddler Puzzle therefore combines learning and play, giving young children an enjoyable way to develop foundational skills that can support their learning as they progress through school. This shows AMO Programme's focus on providing practical and child-friendly learning resources for early years education. For children, what may look like a simple colourful puzzle is, in reality, an opportunity to learn and explore.
