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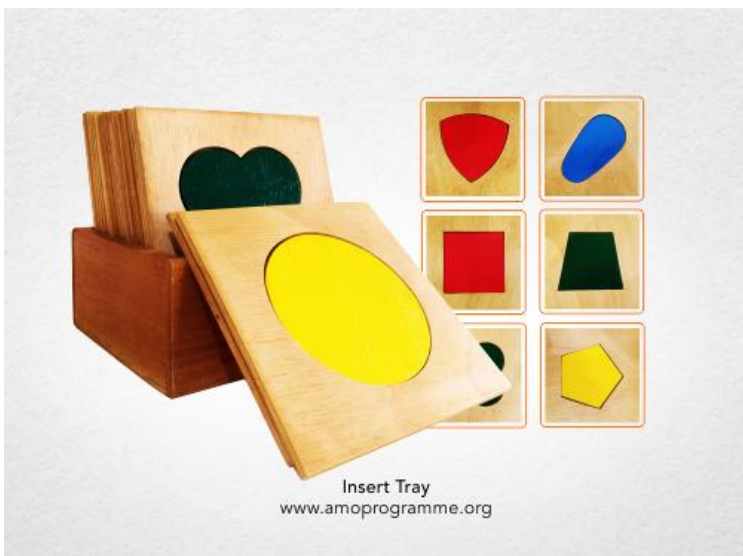
AMO Programme Celebrates 30th Anniversary Tree Planting at Agogo Presby Women's College

Product Spotlight: Insert Tray

The Insert Tray is a hands-on learning resource designed to help children develop essential early learning skills through play. Suitable for learners from Kindergarten to Basic 6, the Insert Tray introduces children to 10 different shapes in bright red, yellow, blue, and green, making learning both engaging and enjoyable.

Each tray consists of three components a solid shape, a matching hollow tray, and a base. As learners match and fit the shapes together, they strengthen their problem-solving abilities, hand-eye coordination, and fine motor skills. The hollow trays also provide an opportunity for children to trace the shapes, helping them develop a firm pencil grip and prepare for writing.

The Insert Tray is an excellent teaching aid for lessons on shapes, colors, and spatial awareness, while also encouraging independent exploration and critical thinking. When the trays are mixed up, children are challenged to sort and correctly match all ten shapes, turning learning into an exciting and rewarding experience.

Like all AMO learning materials, the Insert Tray is crafted from durable, high-quality wood, ensuring it can withstand years of classroom and home use.
